LEVEL 1 BEHAVIORAL CODES

(Minor Disruptive Behaviors)

- 1B Inappropriate public display of affection
- 1C Running, tripping, pushing, hitting or similar aggressive acts
- 1E Tardiness
- 1I Unauthorized possession or use of toys, audio or wireless communication devices, collectibles, or other items or materials that are inappropriate for an educational setting
- 1K Violation of dress or appearance code
- 1L Unauthorized location
- 1M Violation of traffic, parking, bus or bicycle regulations
- 1P Failure to comply with classroom, school, or bus rules
- 1Q Disrespect toward student or staff

LEVEL 2 BEHAVIORAL CODES

(Disruptive Behaviors)

- 2B Disruptive behavior
- 2C Skipping or leaving class without permission
- 2E Failure to comply or complete previously assigned intervention strategies
- 2F Fighting, physical confrontation without injury; also instigating or encouraging a fight
- 2G Unwanted teasing or taunting of others
- 2H Defacing and/or destroying school or personal property resulting in damages of less than \$1,000.00
- 2I Obscene gestures/language; distribution of objects, literature or materials that are inappropriate for an educational setting
- 2J Leaving school grounds without permission
- 2L Truancy
- 2M Academic dishonesty, cheating, plagiarism, violation of copyright laws
- 2N Misrepresentation, providing false information to school personnel, or lying about a school staff member
- 2O Having a toy/imitation weapon
- 2Q Violation of campus or bus safety rules
- 2R Defying, disobeying, or disrespecting school personnel
- 2S Having or using matches, lighters fireworks, smoke stink bombs, laser pens or other unauthorized items
- 2T Theft or accessory to theft of property worth less than \$300.00
- 2U Profane or provocative language
- 2V Gang-related disruption; may include materials, dress or hand signs

LEVEL 3 BEHAVIORAL CODES

(Most Serious Behaviors – Must Match SESIR)

- 3D Mutual altercation that requires physical restraint or results in injury requiring medical attention **(FIT)**^{III}
- 3E Physical use of force or violence (hitting, striking, harming) by an individual against another who does not retaliate, battery requires LEO involvement and more serious bodily injury **(BAT*)^I, (PHA)^{II}**
- 3F Using, possessing, selling, purchasing or distributing alcohol, controlled substances, drugs, drug related items, or substance represented to be a drug **(ALC*)^{IV}, (DRU*)^{III}, (DRD*)^{II}**
- 3G Having weapons, including any dirk, knife, metallic knuckles, slungshot, billie, tear gas gun, chemical weapon or device, or other deadly weapon as defined in state statute **(WPO*)^{II}**
- 3H Theft, or accessory to theft of property, \$300.00 or more **(STL*)^{III}**
- 3I Sexual harassment **(SXH)^{III}**
- 3K Major disruption on campus; taking part in a riot **(DOC*)^{III}**
- 3L Arson, setting fire to a building or other property **(ARS*)^I**
- 3M Bomb threats, false fire alarms or hoaxes **(DOC*)^{III}**
- 3N Extortion or robbery **(ROB*)^{II}**
- 3O Intimidating school staff or students or threatening them with violence or sexual assault **(TRE*)^{III}, (SXA)^{II}**
- 3P Bullying, harassment or hazing of staff or students **(BUL)^{IV}, (HAR)^{IV}, (UBL), (UHR), (HAZ)^{III}**

- 3R Violations of other criminal laws **(OMC*)^{III}, (HOM*)^I, (KID*)^I, (SXB*)^I, (BRK*)^{II}, (TRS*)^{III}**
- 3S Habitual or serious breach of bus rules
- 3T Possession or use of tobacco products or look-alikes **(TBC)^{IV}**
- 3U Defacing and/or destroying school or personal property resulting in damage of \$1,000.00 or more **(VAN*)^{II}**
- 3V Sexual contact, including intercourse, without force or threat of force. Subjecting an individual to lewd sexual gestures, sexual activity, or exposing private body parts in a lewd manner. Must involve law enforcement. **(SXO*)^{III}**
- 3W Dangerous objects: razor blades, box cutters, common pocket knives, air soft guns, mace/pepper spray, chemicals or toy/imitation/look-alike weapons or similar items

NOTES:

1. **BUS REFERRALS:** All Codes may be used for Bus Discipline Referrals
2. **SESIR CODES** followed by an asterisk (*) must be reported to the SRO and/or law enforcement
3. **SESIR CODES: Levels I – IV** refer to the Rank Ordering of Incident Types (Most Serious- L I to Least Serious- L IV). Use the most serious code when multiple incidents occur at the same time and place
4. **UNSUBSTANTIATED BULLYING (UBL) OR HARASSMENT (UHR):** If it is determined that there is not enough evidence to substantiate that the incident meets the criteria of a prohibited act under definition of bullying or harassment as listed F.S. 1006.147. Reporting this data is required by F.S. 1006.147
5. ***SCHOOL RELATED ARREST:** Use this code only when a student is arrested due to referral by a school official during this school year, but there is no corresponding school disciplinary offense

- 30 Conference with Student
- 31 Conference with Parent
- 32 Assignment of reflective written work, work detail, and/or restitution
- 33 Behavioral or Student Self-Improvement Agreement
- 34 Loss of Privileges
- 35 Peer Mediation
- 36 Parent shadowing and/or daily or weekly report to parents
- 37 Referral to Guidance Counselor, School Nurse, School Psychologist, School Social Worker, School Resource Officer, Behavior Specialist, School-Based Intervention Team (S-BIT), or Community Agency or Services
- 38 Detention
- 39 Bicycle Privilege Revoked
- 40 Parking Privilege Revoked
- 41 Referral to Dept. of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles
- 42 In-School Suspension (The student will report to school at the stipulated time but will not be able to follow the regular schedule or to attend extracurricular activities)
- 43 Bus Suspension (The student will not access school transportation, for any reason, during the period of suspension. The student is required to attend school during the period of bus suspension)
- 44 Out-of-School Suspension (The student will not be permitted on any School Board property during the period of suspension)
- 45 Referral to Teen Court
- 46 Referral to Law Enforcement Agency (Investigation/Arrest)
- 47 Recommendation for Bus Expulsion
- 48 Recommendation for Expulsion
- 49 Alternative to Suspension
- 50 Change of Placement (ESE only, 45-Day Rule)
- 51 Threat Assessment
- 52 Functional Behavioral Assessment/Behavior Plan
- 53 Confiscation of Items or Devices
- 54 Mechanical Restraint
- 55 Physical Restraint
- 56 Seclusion
- 57 Recommendation for Alternative Placement
